The Role of Small-Scale Entrepreneurs in Employment Generation and Regional Development in Madhya Pradesh: A Study

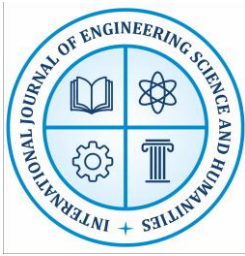
Abstract

This research paper is based on the topic "The Role of Small-Scale Entrepreneurs in Employment Generation and Regional Development in Madhya Pradesh: A Study." The objective of the study is to analyze the contribution of the Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSME) sector in Madhya Pradesh to employment generation, regional development, and socio-economic progress. The study employs a descriptive and analytical research design and utilizes secondary data. Data obtained from the Government of Madhya Pradesh, the Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (Government of India), Economic Surveys, the Reserve Bank of India, NITI Aayog, and other published research papers and reports have been analyzed.

The study reveals that the MSME sector in Madhya Pradesh is continuously expanding. The number of registered MSME units in the state rose from 2.46 lakh in 2021–22 to 6.85 lakh in 2025–26. During the same period, employment generated by the MSME sector increased from 14.08 lakh to 40.50 lakh. This growth indicates that small-scale enterprises have established themselves as a major source of employment generation in the state. A Pearson Correlation Test was used to test the hypothesis, yielding a correlation coefficient (r) of 0.979 and a p -value of 0.0036. The results demonstrate a very high and statistically significant positive relationship between the development of small-scale enterprises and employment generation. Consequently, the null hypothesis was rejected, and the alternative hypothesis was accepted.

The study also highlights that the MSME sector is not limited merely to providing employment; it plays a pivotal role in rural industrialization, value addition to local resources, women and youth entrepreneurship, income growth, the reduction of migration, and balanced regional development.

1. Introduction

India is one of the world's fastest-growing economies, with a significant portion of its population falling within the working-age group. In this context, job creation stands as a paramount priority for national development. Relying solely on government employment cannot meet the job requirements of the growing population; therefore, the development of entrepreneurship—particularly small-scale enterprises—has become a cornerstone of economic progress.

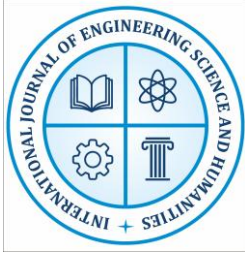
Small-scale enterprises are considered the bedrock of any economy's development because they possess the capacity to generate substantial employment with limited capital. While large industries tend to be capital-intensive, small-scale industries are labor-intensive. Consequently, small-scale industries are regarded as the most effective vehicle for employment growth in developing nations.

Madhya Pradesh is India's second-largest state in terms of geographical area. The state is rich in natural resources, agricultural produce, forest wealth, mineral deposits, and human capital. Despite this, many districts in the state have remained relatively backward in terms of industrialization. In this scenario, small-scale enterprises have emerged as effective instruments for utilizing local resources, fostering rural industrialization, and ensuring balanced regional development.

Several schemes are being implemented in the state to foster the growth of Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs). Key initiatives include the *Mukhyamantri Udyam Kranti Yojana*, *Pradhan Mantri Employment Generation Programme* (PMEGP), *Pradhan Mantri MUDRA Yojana*, the Startup Policy, the Industrial Promotion Policy, the 'One District One Product' (ODOP) program, and various skill development initiatives. Through these schemes, entrepreneurs are provided with financial assistance, training, marketing support, and technical guidance.

Small-scale enterprises are not merely confined to economic activities; they also serve as vital agents of social change. They enable women, youth, Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, and backward classes to secure self-employment. This helps reduce income inequality and accelerates inclusive growth.

In Madhya Pradesh, alongside industrial hubs like Indore, Bhopal, Jabalpur, and Gwalior, the expansion of agriculture- and forest-based small-scale industries in districts such as Khandwa, Kargone, Dhar, Chhindwara, Balaghat, Mandla, and Shahdol is steering the rural economy in a new direction. Sectors such as food processing, the soybean industry, the spice industry, pulse

mills, handlooms, handicrafts, furniture manufacturing, the bamboo industry, and enterprises run by women's self-help groups have emerged as key sources of local employment.

In the current era of global competition, digitalization, e-commerce, innovation, and green production methods have created new opportunities for small enterprises. Many entrepreneurs are now expanding their businesses by leveraging digital marketing, online trade, digital payments, and modern production techniques. This is enabling local products to reach national and international markets.

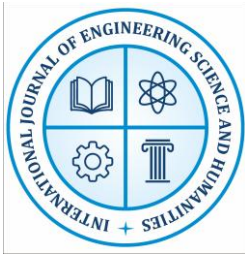
However, small enterprises also face numerous challenges. Factors such as a lack of financial resources, difficulties in securing bank loans, technological backwardness, an absence of quality standards, marketing issues, transportation costs, and global competition impact their growth. Therefore, it is essential that these challenges are adequately addressed during policy formulation.

Against this backdrop, the present study analyzes the role of small-scale entrepreneurs in Madhya Pradesh and seeks to highlight how small enterprises are making significant contributions to employment generation, income growth, poverty alleviation, and regional development.

2. Major Government Schemes for the Development of Small Enterprises in Madhya Pradesh

Several schemes are being implemented by the Central and State governments to encourage small enterprises in Madhya Pradesh. Their objectives include simplifying the process of setting up enterprises, providing financial assistance, promoting technological upgrades, and fostering employment generation.

- **Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP)** – This scheme provides a loan-cum-subsidy facility for establishing micro-enterprises. It assists educated unemployed youth, women, Scheduled Castes (SC), Scheduled Tribes (ST), and other vulnerable sections in establishing self-employment ventures.
- **Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojana (PMMY)** – Under this scheme, collateral-free loans are provided across three categories: Shishu, Kishore, and Tarun. Thousands of new enterprises have been established in Madhya Pradesh through this scheme.
- **Chief Minister's Udyam Kranti Yojana** – Launched by the Government of Madhya Pradesh, this scheme aims to provide financial assistance to youth for self-employment. It offers interest subsidies and loan facilities.
- **One District One Product (ODOP)** – Under this program, efforts are being made to promote the unique product of each district, thereby providing local industries access to national and global markets.

- **Startup Policy** – A startup policy has been implemented in the state to encourage innovation-based enterprises. It provides training, mentorship, financial assistance, and incubation facilities.

3. Statement of the Problem

The Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSME) sector is considered the backbone of growth in India's economy. In addition to making a significant contribution to the country's Gross Domestic Product (GDP), this sector plays a vital role in employment generation, export promotion, innovation, and balanced regional development. While small enterprises are continuously expanding in Madhya Pradesh, industrial development across the state's various regions has been uneven. Cities such as Indore, Bhopal, Jabalpur, and Gwalior are industrially developed, whereas many tribal and backward districts remain relatively underdeveloped in terms of entrepreneurship.

Small enterprises in the state face challenges such as a lack of capital, technological backwardness, a shortage of skilled labor, limited marketing infrastructure, difficulties in obtaining quality certification, and limited adoption of digital technologies. Due to these challenges, many enterprises are unable to grow to their full potential.

On the other hand, both the state and central governments are actively promoting entrepreneurship through initiatives such as the Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP), Pradhan Mantri MUDRA Yojana (PMMY), Chief Minister's Udyam Kranti Yojana, the Startup Policy, the Atmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyan, One District One Product (ODOP), and various skill development programs. It is essential to evaluate the actual impact of these schemes.

Therefore, this study seeks to determine the extent to which small enterprises in Madhya Pradesh are contributing to employment generation and regional development, as well as to identify the key opportunities and challenges associated with their growth.

4. Need and Significance of the Study

Currently, India is one of the world's rapidly growing economies. The development of entrepreneurship is considered crucial for accelerating economic growth and mitigating the problem of unemployment. A large segment of Madhya Pradesh's population resides in rural areas, where income sources are limited due to an overwhelming reliance on agriculture. In such a scenario, small-scale enterprises offer alternative employment opportunities.

The need for this study arises from the following reasons:

1. To evaluate the actual contribution of small-scale enterprises to employment generation in Madhya Pradesh.
2. To study the role of small-scale enterprises in reducing regional disparities.

5. Objectives of the Study

The primary objectives of this research paper are as follows:

1. To study the current status of small-scale enterprises in Madhya Pradesh.
2. To analyze the contribution made by small-scale enterprises towards employment generation.

6. Research Hypotheses

H₀₁: Small-scale enterprises in Madhya Pradesh have no significant impact on employment generation.

H₁₁: Small-scale enterprises in Madhya Pradesh have a significant positive impact on employment generation.

7. Research Methodology

The present study is based on a descriptive and analytical research methodology. The objective of the study is to analyze the current status of small-scale enterprises in Madhya Pradesh and their role in employment generation and regional development. This research utilizes secondary data compiled from the Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (Government of India). The entire state of Madhya Pradesh has been selected as the study area. A comparative analysis has been conducted on data regarding registered MSME units and the employment generated by them during the period from 2021–22 to 2025–26. The collected data is presented using tables and percentage growth figures, and the relationship between small-scale enterprises and employment generation has been examined using the Pearson Correlation Test. The study's findings are interpreted based on descriptive analysis. As the study relies entirely on secondary data, periodic updates or minor discrepancies in data across various sources are acknowledged as a limitation.

8. Results and Interpretation

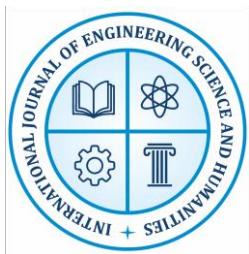
Madhya Pradesh is a state rich in natural resources, agriculture, minerals, forest wealth, and human resources. The Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSME) sector has emerged as a key pillar of industrial development in the state. There has been continuous expansion of small enterprises across sectors such as agro-based industries, food processing, textile manufacturing, pharmaceuticals, engineering products, handicrafts, forest-based industries, and services. The MSME sector has witnessed significant growth over the past few years, driven by state government initiatives aimed at simplifying the process of setting up industries, facilitating online registration, and providing investment incentives, financial assistance, skill development, and entrepreneurship promotion.

Table 1 above shows that in the year 2021–22, there were 2.46 lakh registered MSME units in Madhya Pradesh, providing employment to approximately 14.08 lakh people. In 2022–23, the number of registered units rose to 3.54 lakh, and employment reached 18.33 lakh. This growth indicates an accelerated pace of enterprise establishment and an expansion of employment opportunities within the state.

In 2023–24, the number of registered MSMEs increased to 4.57 lakh, while employment generated by them reached 22.77 lakh. This trend demonstrates that small enterprises in the state are continuously strengthening, not only in terms of numbers but also regarding their capacity for job creation.

In 2024–25, the number of registered units reached 5.79 lakh, and employment rose to 29.61 lakh. During this period, initiatives such as industrial investment, digital registration, Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojana, Pradhan Mantri Employment Generation Programme, Chief Minister's Udyam Kranti Yojana, and startup promotion schemes played a pivotal role in the establishment of new enterprises. According to available data for the year 2025–26, the number of registered MSMEs reached 6.85 lakh, with employment generation through them touching 40.50 lakh. This reflects a significant increase compared to the preceding five years. It is evident that the MSME sector in Madhya Pradesh has emerged as the most dynamic sector for job creation, and its role in the state's economic and regional development is continuously strengthening.

Thus, it is clear that the MSME sector in Madhya Pradesh is not merely a foundation for industrial production; rather, it is emerging as a powerful vehicle for employment generation,

The Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME) sector is a key pillar of employment generation in the economies of both India and Madhya Pradesh. Compared to large-scale industries, small enterprises utilize a larger workforce with relatively less capital, thereby creating employment opportunities on a vast scale. This is why they are termed labor-intensive industries. In an agrarian and developing state like Madhya Pradesh, small enterprises have emerged as vital sources of self-employment and local employment in rural and semi-urban areas.

A distinctive feature of small enterprises is that they expand production and services by leveraging local resources, traditional skills, and the available workforce. These industries provide employment and self-employment opportunities to youth, women, Scheduled Castes (SC), Scheduled Tribes (ST), and economically weaker sections. Furthermore, they play a significant role in preserving family-based industries, boosting income in rural areas, and curbing migration to metropolitan cities.

Table 2 above clearly indicates a consistent rise in employment generated by the MSME sector in Madhya Pradesh. In the year 2021–22, approximately 14.08 lakh people were employed; this figure rose to 18.33 lakh in 2022–23, marking an increase of 4.25 lakh (30.18 percent) during this period.

In 2023–24, the employment figure climbed to 22.77 lakh, an increase of 4.44 lakh (24.22 percent) over the previous year. This demonstrates that employment opportunities are steadily

growing due to the establishment of new small enterprises and the expansion of existing units within the state.

By 2024–25, employment reached 29.61 lakh. A significant increase of 6.84 lakh (30.04 percent) in employment was recorded during this year. This growth can be attributed to the positive impact of policies promoting industrial investment, the Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojana, the Pradhan Mantri Employment Generation Programme, the Chief Minister's Udyam Kranti Yojana, and digital entrepreneurship.

In the year 2025–26, the MSME sector provided employment to 40.50 lakh people, marking the highest level recorded during the study period. An increase of 10.89 lakh (36.78 percent) in employment was observed compared to the year 2024–25. This indicates that the MSME sector in Madhya Pradesh is expanding rapidly in terms of employment generation and has become a vital pillar of the state's economy.

Thus, it can be concluded that the MSME sector in Madhya Pradesh has emerged as the most effective vehicle for employment generation. If financial assistance, technological upgradation, marketing support, innovation, and skill development are further strengthened, this sector will play an even more significant role in achieving the state's goals of economic progress, inclusive growth, and self-reliance in the future.

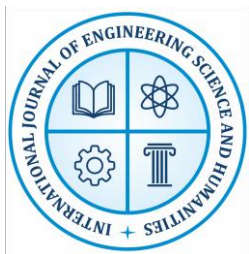
9. Role of Small Enterprises in Regional Development

In Madhya Pradesh, the Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSME) sector is not limited merely to employment generation; it also serves as a crucial foundation for regional economic, social, and industrial development. Between the years 2021–22 and 2025–26, the number of registered MSME units rose from 2.46 lakh to 6.85 lakh, while employment figures increased from 14.08 lakh to 40.50 lakh. This growth clearly demonstrates that the expansion of small enterprises in the state has imparted fresh momentum to regional development. The establishment of industries at the local level has led to the decentralization of economic activities and created new opportunities for development in rural and semi-urban areas.

(1) Increase in Income

According to available data, the MSME sector provided employment to 14.08 lakh people in the year 2021–22; this figure rose to 40.50 lakh by 2025–26. This significant growth in employment boosted the incomes of lakhs of families, leading to positive changes in their purchasing power, savings capacity, and standard of living. Commercial activities in local markets increased, and there was an expansion in both consumption and investment.

(2) Rural Industrialization

The number of registered MSME units in Madhya Pradesh rose from 2.46 lakh to 6.85 lakh over a period of five years. This growth indicates that industrial activities have developed rapidly in the state's rural and semi-urban areas as well. The establishment of agro-based industries, food processing units, handicrafts, dairy ventures, forest produce processing units, and micro-manufacturing units has given a new direction to the rural economy and increased local employment opportunities.

(3) Reduction in Migration

When employment and self-employment opportunities are available in rural areas, people's dependence on large cities decreases. Due to the expansion of the MSME sector, local youth have begun finding employment within their own districts or in nearby areas. This has led to a reduction in economic migration towards metropolitan cities and improved the social and economic stability of families.

(4) Infrastructure Development

Alongside the growth of small enterprises, infrastructural facilities in industrial areas have also expanded. The establishment of industries has fostered the development of amenities such as roads, electricity supply, drinking water, banking services, digital payment systems, internet connectivity, warehousing, transportation, and logistics. This has yielded direct benefits for the local community in addition to the industries themselves.

(5) Utilization of Local Resources

Madhya Pradesh is a state rich in agricultural, forest, and mineral resources. The MSME sector has played a pivotal role in the local utilization and value addition of these resources. The processing of soybeans, wheat, pulses, spices, fruits, and vegetables; bamboo and wood-based industries; the processing of medicinal and aromatic plants; and mineral-based small-scale industries are examples of the optimal utilization of local resources. This has enhanced both the competitiveness and the market value of local products.

(6) Social Development

The rise in employment and income has also had a positive impact on social development. Economic stability has increased the capacity of families to spend on education and healthcare. Women's entrepreneurship has been encouraged, the activities of self-help groups have expanded, and the economic empowerment of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe communities has been strengthened. Consequently, there has been a notable improvement in the standard of living, increased social participation, and significant progress towards inclusive development.

10. Hypothesis Testing

H₀₁: Small enterprises in Madhya Pradesh have no significant impact on employment generation.

H₁₁: Small enterprises in Madhya Pradesh have a significant positive impact on employment generation.

The Pearson Correlation Test has been used to test this hypothesis because we have two continuous variables available:

- Independent variable (X): Registered MSMEs (in lakhs)
- Dependent variable (Y): Employment (in lakhs)

the result is statistically significant at the 5% significance level.

Therefore,

The null hypothesis (H₀₁) is rejected, and the alternative hypothesis (H₁₁) is accepted.

The results clearly indicate a very high positive correlation (r = 0.979) between the number of registered MSMEs and employment generation in Madhya Pradesh. This implies that as the number of small enterprises in the state increased, there was a significant rise in employment opportunities as well.

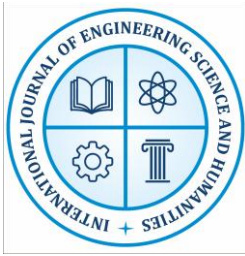
During the study period (2021–22 to 2025–26), the number of registered MSME units rose from 2.46 lakh to 6.85 lakh, and employment increased from 14.08 lakh to 40.50 lakh. The p-value of 0.0036 obtained from the correlation test indicates that this relationship is not merely due to chance but is statistically significant.

Thus, it is concluded that the expansion of small enterprises in Madhya Pradesh has had a significant and positive impact on employment generation.

11. Conclusion

Based on the research paper titled "Role of Small-Scale Entrepreneurs in Employment Generation and Regional Development in Madhya Pradesh: A Study," it is evident that the Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSME) sector has emerged as a robust and dynamic pillar of the state's economy. This sector not only accelerates industrial production and economic activities but also contributes significantly to large-scale employment generation, the promotion of self-employment, income growth, and balanced regional development.

According to the data available for the study period (2021–22 to 2025–26), the number of registered MSME units in Madhya Pradesh rose from 2.46 lakh to 6.85 lakh, while the employment generated through them increased from 14.08 lakh to 40.50 lakh. This growth demonstrates that the expansion of small-scale enterprises in the state has been accompanied by a continuous rise in employment opportunities. The results of the hypothesis test (Pearson Correlation Test)—showing r = 0.979 and p-value = 0.0036—indicate a very strong and statistically significant positive correlation between the development of small-scale enterprises

and employment generation. Consequently, the null hypothesis was rejected, and the alternative hypothesis was accepted.

The study further reveals that the impact of small-scale enterprises extends beyond mere employment generation. They have accelerated industrialization in rural and semi-urban areas, facilitated better utilization of local resources, enhanced value addition for agricultural and forest products, and created new self-employment opportunities for women, youth, and Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST) communities. These developments have led to positive outcomes such as reduced regional disparities, controlled migration, and a strengthened local economy.

The study also found that schemes such as the Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojana, Pradhan Mantri Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP), Chief Minister's Udyam Kranti Yojana, and other industrial incentive schemes have played a pivotal role in promoting the establishment of enterprises. Despite this, challenges such as limited financial resources, a lack of modern technology, marketing difficulties, a shortage of quality training, and global competition continue to confront small enterprises.

Thus, it can be concluded that if the state government, financial institutions, the Industries Department, educational institutions, and the private sector make concerted efforts to effectively provide entrepreneurs with finance, technology, skills, marketing support, and digital facilities, the MSME sector can play an even more significant role in employment generation, balanced regional development, and the creation of a self-reliant economy in Madhya Pradesh. Therefore, small enterprises should be viewed not merely as industrial units, but as key agents of social and economic transformation.
